| Monitoring Funds provided effectiveness monitoring to evaluate treatment for Medusahead Rye as a method to improve sage-grouse habitat in the Keating Valley and provide for long-term water quality monitoring in the Powder Basin. | 96,988 | |
| Restoration Thirty four grants provided funding for a variety of restoration projects that include noxious weed or juniper removal, rehabilitating riparian areas, creating irrigation efficiencies, and improving instream or upland habitats. For example, the damaged Kay Young diversion on Eagle Creek was repaired and upgraded, providing improved irrigation efficiency while restoring fish passage and water quality. | 1,240,862 | |
| Technical Assistance A variety of grants provided technical design or planning assistance for projects intended to create irrigation efficiencies, modify diversion structures, or enhance riparian areas in the Eagle and Baker Valleys; as well as assess stream conditions in the Burnt River area. | 180,586 | |
