Together, these acquisitions protect high-value prairie and oak savanna habitats and one of the largest known populations of the endangered Fender's Blue Butterfly and threatened Kincaid's Lupine.	1,084,108	
Local Capacity-Watershed Councils and SWCD Funds provided to the Marys River Watershed Council to support community efforts to protect and enhance clean water and healthy habitats for fish and wildlife. Funds provided to local Soil and Water Conservation Districts support implementation of Agricultural Water Quality Management Area Plans. This project includes providing outreach and technical assistance intended to improve landowner involvement in conservation activities that enhance water quality and salmon habitat.	94,312

<p>Outreach and Education Funding for a program that targeted local students, teachers, and volunteers to participate in field visits centered on riparian and upland restoration. These field visits were supported by in-classroom and greenhouse instruction.</p>	25,000	
<p>Restoration Sixteen grants provided funding for a variety of restoration projects that include removing invasive plants, rehabilitating riparian areas, improving instream habitat and fish passage, and restoring wetland, prairie, and oak savanna habitats. For example, 150 acres in the Harkens Lake and Horseshoe Island area will be restored to riparian floodplain forest and oak savanna.</p>	892,610	
<p>Technical Assistance Funds provided technical engineering, design or planning assistance for projects intended to enhance riparian areas within the county and assess potential restoration activities between the McKenzie-Willamette River confluence and Corvallis.</p>	179,021
