<p>Waldport High School Abatement Project The Lincoln County School District (District) purchased the 7.92 acre property in Waldport, Oregon in 1955 as the site for the Waldport High School campus. The Property is located entirely within the mapped tsunami inundation zone for both distant and local tsunamis. The Campus is also located within the FEMA mapped floodplain and the existing buildings have substantial seismic deficiencies and pose a high risk of damage and casualties in earthquakes. In February 2013, the Lincoln County School District received a FEMA Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) Grant of \$3 million to demolish the former High School Campus and to reuse the property as open space either as a park or nature reserve. However, asbestos removal expenses were not considered as part of the FEMA PDM grant award and the District has insufficient funds to cover the full cost of removing asbestos and other hazardous building materials prior to demolition. The Lincoln County School District is seeking funding assistance to complete removal of asbestos containing materials as well as other hazardous building materials as preparation for demolition of buildings that comprise the former Waldport High School Campus.</p>	60,000	
<p>Port of Alsea Property Purchase The Port would like to purchase an adjacent property for the purpose of renting to increase their revenue stream. The Port is also considering using the property to expand parking available for the Port as well as leasing some of the improvements.</p>		125,000

<p>Bayshore Special Road District Sand Removal & Road Repaving The District is requesting funding for emergency project sand removal and road repaving.</p>	68,625	
<p>Port of Newport International Terminal Gap Financing The Port is requesting funding for gap financing for project construction.</p>	500,000	3,000,000
<p>Silver Sands Special Road District Culvert Washout Emergency Project The Recipient has submitted an application to FEMA and is requesting the 25% match funding for final design and construction to replace the culvert pipe, roadbed material and asphalt at Buckley Creek on Sarisian.</p>	4,685

Local Capacity-Watershed Councils and SWCD Funds provided to the MidCoast Watershed Council to support community efforts to protect and enhance clean water and healthy habitats for fish and wildlife. Funds provided to local Soil and Water Conservation Districts support implementation of Agricultural Water Quality Management Area Plans. This project includes providing outreach and technical assistance intended to improve landowner involvement in conservation activities that enhance water quality and salmon habitat.	105,578	
Monitoring Funds were provided to monitor the effectiveness of past restoration activities in the Little Fall Creek area and continue a program that monitors past restoration projects, evaluates baseline monitoring for new projects, and conducts pre-project inventory assessments in several river basins within the county.	130,128	
Outreach and Education Provided funding for a program to present watershed education and conservation career development ideas to Lincoln City middle and high school students by means of involving them in local watershed council activities. Funds also supported the Natural Resource Crew program, intended to engage students during the school year and summer in hands-on restoration activities.	74,988	
Restoration Eighteen grants provided funding for a variety of restoration projects that include installing riparian exclusion fencing, reducing sediment and nutrients from entering streams, removing noxious and invasive plants; rehabilitating riparian, wetland and upland areas, creating a salvage log inventory for instream restoration use, and improving instream habitat and fish passage. For example, a project to replace an undersized culvert under Highway 101 near the Siletz River estuary will now allow fish and tidal flows into the historic 40-acre marsh upstream.	687,113	
Technical Assistance Funds provided technical assistance to inventory, evaluate baseline conditions, and create management plans for recent conservation acquisitions.	42,000
