Local Capacity-Watershed Councils and SWCD Funds provided to the Malheur and Owyhee Watershed Councils to support community efforts to protect and enhance clean water and healthy habitats for fish and wildlife. Funds provided to local Soil and Water Conservation Districts support implementation of Agricultural Water Quality Management Area Plans. This project includes providing outreach and technical assistance intended to improve landowner involvement in conservation activities that enhance water quality and salmon habitat.	393,131	
Monitoring Funds were provided to monitor and collect current or past data from 46 watershed irrigation districts drains that, ultimately, contribute nutrients deposited in each drain to the Malheur and Snake River systems.	123,994	
Outreach and Education Provided funding to support educational efforts intended to increase student, landowner, and community awareness and understanding of watershed health and noxious weed issues. Also provided funding for a project engaging Malheur River Basin farmers to understand the potential outcomes for adopting best management practices in agriculture.	64,551

<b>Restoration</b> Sixty-one grants provided funding for a variety of restoration projects that include removing invasive plants, managing western juniper, creating irrigation efficiencies, and installing riparian exclusion fencing. Many of these projects involved changes to current irrigation systems, which helps to conserve water and improve water quality by reducing nitrates, E.coli, pesticides, and excess sediment from entering streams. For example, piping an earthen irrigation lateral and converting 635 acres to sprinkler irrigation in the Lower Owyhee River watershed means not only conserving water, but also reducing over 10,000 tons of annual sediment from entering local waterways, including the Lower Owyhee River.	2,752,949
