<p>City of Mosier - Historic Columbia Hwy BRF Integrated Planning</p> <p>The Mosier Historic Columbia River Highway Corridor includes two undeveloped properties located in the downtown core of the City of Mosier. These properties, known as the "Bicycle Hub" and the "UP Parcel" represent a significant area of property, are critically located along the city's Main Street, and remain undeveloped in part because of perceived unknown environmental issues associated with past and/or current uses. The "Bicycle Hub" property, acquired in 1978 by the City, was discovered to have once been the location of a gas station that operated between 1930 and 1940; the "UP Parcel" is currently owned by Union Pacific Railroad and has been used by the railroad for over 100 years. The segment of the Columbia River Historic Highway (Hwy 30) which includes the portion that makes up Mosier's main street, is heavily used by recreational cyclists and walkers, but the City has no developed facilities (public restrooms, informational kiosks, water fountain, or dedicated community space) to serve or encourage this type of developing tourism. The City is partnering with the Oregon Department of Transportation – Historic Highway Division (ODOT) – to build a bicycle/pedestrian rest area on the city-owned "Bicycle Hub" property. Although currently owned by the City, it is unknown whether underground storage tanks associated with the former gas station are still in place or if there are any other environmental conditions that would need to be addressed before redevelopment efforts can proceed. The City of Mosier is seeking funding assistance to complete integrated planning activities (environmental assessment activities along with a reuse feasibility study) associated with the portion of the Historic Columbia River Highway Corridor that runs through its downtown and which encompasses the "Bicycle Hub" and "UP Parcel" properties.</p>	25,000

<b>Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board - OWEB</b>		
Acquisition Funding was provided to assist in the permanent acquisition of seven water rights on Fifteenmile Creek. These water rights will provide additional flow to improve habitat for Mid-Columbia Winter Steelhead and will complement the riparian restoration, conservation tillage, and other restoration actions being taken in the Fifteenmile Creek Basin.	100,000	
Local Capacity-Watershed Councils and SWCD Funding for the Wasco County Watershed Council to support community efforts to protect and enhance clean water and healthy habitats for fish and wildlife. Funds provided to local Soil and Water Conservation Districts support implementation of Agricultural Water Quality Management Area Plans. This project includes providing outreach and technical assistance intended to improve landowner involvement in conservation activities that enhance water quality and salmon habitat.	94,312	
Outreach and Education Funds provided outreach to inform and recruit landowners in the Fifteenmile watershed interested in water right leasing and banking to increase instream flows. Funds also provided training for professionals doing on-the-ground restoration in Wasco County.	14,504	
Restoration Eighteen grants provided funding for a variety of restoration projects that include removing invasive plants, creating irrigation efficiencies, improving orchard management practices, eliminating vehicle crossings in steelhead-bearing streams, improving instream habitat, and removing fish passage barriers. For example, by modifying irrigation diversion dams on Badger, Threemile, and Mill Creeks, Redband Trout will now have safe passage to upstream habitat.	783,968	
Technical Assistance Funds provided landowners with technical assessment and design assistance in support of creating interest in, and establishing conservation plans for, riparian buffers as an important effort to improve water quality and fish habitat within Wasco County.	109,821
