Acquisitions Grants provided a portion of the funding for The Boneyard Ridge Project that links two large existing conservation areas and stewards a temperate rainforest habitat to maturity.	524,400	
Local Capacity-SWCD Funds provided to one Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) to implement the Agricultural Water Quality Management Area Plan to the fullest extent practical. This project includes providing outreach and technical assistance to local landowners to: 1) promote and implement the Oregon Plan for Salmon and Watersheds; 2) improve landowner involvement in conservation activities that enhance water quality and habitat for salmon; and 3) develop assessments and apply strategies to achieve the goals of the Oregon Plan.	141,860	
Outreach The grant continues the Lower Columbia River Estuary Partnership's Watershed Stewardship Project in elementary schools in Lower Columbia River communities from Scappoose to Warrenton. The program includes classroom lessons, field experiences, and a service learning watershed enhancement project and is designed so participants will learn about and develop an increased appreciation of their local watershed.	61,194	
Restoration Twelve grants provided funding for a variety of restoration projects such as improving water quality including nutrient management; addressing aquatic and terrestrial invasive weeds; restoring riparian areas; and improving instream habitat and fish passage. For example, in the Wallooskee River, a significant tributary to Young's Bay in Clatsop County, two undersized and perched fish passage barrier culverts were replaced and 35 large wood structures were placed in 1.76 miles of the headwater reaches.	235,660	
Technical Assistance A grant allowed the MidCoast Watershed Council to provide tools that will help identify, protect, conserve, and restore lands that are expected to be future tidal wetlands under different sea-level rise scenarios.	50,000


