<p>Acquisitions Grant provided a portion of the funding to permanently protect 215 acres in the lower Umpqua River. The project will protect tidal wetlands providing a significant amount of nursery habitat for juvenile salmonids, including ESA-listed Oregon coast coho as well as other native fish species. Other Umpqua Basin priority species expected to benefit from the project include northern red-legged frog; Bullock's oriole; olive-sided, Pacific-slope, and willow flycatcher; and rufous hummingbird. Upland forest will also be acquired around most of the project area, providing a permanently-protected buffer that can offer resilience to sea level rise and potential intensification of land uses.</p>	547,500	
<p>Local Capacity-SWCD Funds provided to two Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCDs) to implement the Agricultural Water Quality Management Area Plan to the fullest extent practical. These projects include providing outreach and technical assistance to local landowners to: 1) promote and implement the Oregon Plan for Salmon and Watersheds; 2) improve landowner involvement in conservation activities that enhance water quality and habitat for salmon; and 3) develop assessments and apply strategies to achieve the goals of the Oregon Plan.</p>	283,720	
<p>Monitoring Funds provided to gather water quality data and build on past monitoring efforts by prioritizing previously monitored sites and establishing reference sites for continued monitoring.</p>	284,113	
<p>Outreach Funding provided to partner with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's Fish Eggs to Fry program to provide teachers with the resources needed to effectively educate elementary-aged students about water quality, salmonids, their life cycle, and habitat needs; and to engage people in improving instream and riparian conditions for fish and other aquatic life by removing harmful trash and debris from the Umpqua's rivers, streams and riparian areas.</p>	20,865


