<p>Condon Radar Station Integrated Planning Project Funding provided to the Port of Arlington Environmental Sentry Corporation to complete a redevelopment strategy for the former 58+ acre Condon Radar Station that assesses the physical, economic and regulatory constraints and opportunities of the property; engages the community to generate support and leverage local resources; articulates a future use vision or set of options for redevelopment of the property; creates a critical path that identifies key steps to moving the project forward; and, identifies potential funding sources to support remaining cleanup and redevelopment and position the community to obtain state and federal funding assistance.</p>	25,000	
<p>Emergency Services Building Assessment The South Gilliam County Emergency Services received funding assistance to conduct a Phase Two environmental Site Assessment on property it acquired in 1978 and on which it was planning construction of a new Emergency Services Facility to house its fire apparatus and emergency equipment.</p>	35,000	
<p>Mesa Industrial Park Integrated Planning Grant Funding assistance provided to the City of Arlington to complete integrated planning activities associated with completion of documentation for decision-ready certification of the 438-acre Mesa Industrial Park. These planning activities include completion of a Phase One Environmental Site Assessment to ASTM Loans along with a Threatened and Endangered Species Letter; an Ambient Air Quality Non-Attainment of Maintenance Area Letter; a Stormwater Requirements Letter; a Description of Site and Infrastructure Improvements Letter; a Floodplain map and Letter, and a State Historic Preservation Office Letter.</p>	6,000	
<p>Reser Property Integrated Planning Project Funding assistance was provided to the City of Condon complete redevelopment planning associated with the former Reser property which it acquired in May 2011. Cleanup of the property was completed in July 2014; however, the City lacked sufficient information regarding existing buildings and other infrastructure needs to be responsive to potential developers inquiring about the costs associated with and most suitable future reuse of the site within its zoning parameters.</p>	25,000

This project includes providing outreach and technical assistance to local landowners to: 1) promote and implement the Oregon Plan for Salmon and Watersheds; 2) improve landowner involvement in conservation activities that enhance water quality and habitat for salmon; and 3) develop assessments and apply strategies to achieve the goals of the Oregon Plan.</p>	141,860	



Restoration Fifteen grants provided funding for a variety of restoration projects that include fire restoration; installing riparian exclusion fencing; improving grazing management; treating western juniper; surveying for and addressing noxious and invasive plants; developing off-stream watering sites; and improving water quality. For example, a project chemically, physically, and biologically treated invasive weeds on 1145 acres in the Ferry Canyon / Thirtymile Creek Integrated Weed Management Area.	110,939	
Technical Assistance Funds provided landowners with technical assessment and design assistance in support of the Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program in Gilliam County, and to create a Gilliam-East John Day Watershed Council Action Plan.	24,016
