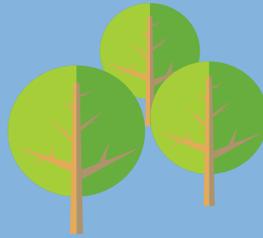

Restoration Thirty-two grants provided funding for a variety of restoration projects that include grazing management improvements; treating western juniper; stimulating aspen growth; addressing noxious and invasive plants; creating irrigation efficiencies; developing off-stream watering sites; improving water quality, riparian and instream habitat; and removing fish passage barriers. For example, the final planned phase of a long-term restoration project in the Oxbow Conservation Area helps restore the main and side channels of the Middle Fork John Day River that were severely damaged by past dredge mining. This restoration significantly improves the watershed function of this highly altered stream channel.	1,221,910	
Technical Assistance Funds provided for planning and designing a system to remove tailing piles and restore a natural stream channel and floodplain, to complete an action plan, and for an aspen inventory.	56,653
