Local Capacity-SWCD Funds provided to two Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCDs) to implement the Agricultural Water Quality Management Area Plan to the fullest extent practical. These project include providing outreach and technical assistance to local landowners to: 1) promote and implement the Oregon Plan for Salmon and Watersheds; 2) improve landowner involvement in conservation activities that enhance water quality and habitat for salmon; and 3) develop assessments and apply strategies to achieve the goals of the Oregon Plan.	283,720	
Monitoring Funds provided for effectiveness monitoring for vernal pools and water quality monitoring.	31,348	
Outreach Provided funding for projects including several outreach projects that targeted middle- and high school students, university students and private landowners by integrating field-focused activities with active watershed restoration, monitoring and enhancement efforts, and development of future projects; and formation of Urban Waters Employee Stewardship Teams at local businesses.	248,472	
Restoration Thirty-two grants provided funding for a variety of restoration projects that include addressing invasive plants; reducing sedimentation and nutrients that enter streams; installing riparian exclusion fencing; developing off-stream watering sites; improving riparian, and instream habitat, fish passage; and restoring prairie, vernal pool, oak savanna and woodland habitats. For example, based on the work completed with previous technical assistance grants a project on Lost Creek, a subsequent project replaced priority culverts, removed an existing rock check-dam, and improved aquatic habitat.	1,664,849	

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

Technical Assistance Funds provided technical assistance for the Eugene Water and Electric Board and its partners to implement a pilot project to test drive the Voluntary Incentives Program (VIP), a non-regulatory approach that compensates landowners to protect healthy riparian forests while encouraging restoration of degraded areas. As part of the VIP, they also a) developed riparian assessment metrics and tools and collected riparian health metrics; b) created fiscal management tools; c) used LiDAR for a watershed and program monitoring tool; and d) developed a web dashboard that tracks watershed health and VIP implementation. Technical assistance was also used to design a project to improve ecological function and biological productivity for spring Chinook salmon and bull trout, Pacific lamprey, and western pond turtle; complete the next design stage for a wetland restoration project; and to develop and adopt a 10-year watershed action plan for the McKenzie Watershed.	267,271
