Albany Fire Station Expansion Assessment Project The City of Albany's Fire Station #11 was scheduled for demolition; however, construction of the replacement facility designed to meet current safety standards was constrained by the property's size. Acquisition of adjacent properties was necessary to accommodate the expanded facility along with safer ingress and egress of emergency vehicles. Funding assistance was provided to the City of Albany to complete its environmental due diligence prior to acquisition of up to 5 privately owned properties located on either side of the City's Fire Station #11.	60,000

Acquisition Grants provided a portion of the funding to permanently protect 61 acres south of Albany in Linn County. The property is a highly functioning floodplain adjacent to the Willamette River. It is contiguous with the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department's 81-acre Riverside Landing Greenway and conservation easements held by Greenbelt Land Trust on 200 acres in the Horseshoe Lake area. The property contains more than 35 acres of bottomland hardwood riparian forests and is interlaced with numerous backchannels that frequently inundate during high water events. The acquisition of this property greatly adds to the connectivity of the floodplain and increases the conservation footprint in this highly dynamic reach of the Willamette River.	134,182	
Local Capacity-SWCD Funds provided to one Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) to implement the Agricultural Water Quality Management Area Plan to the fullest extent practical. This project includes providing outreach and technical assistance to local landowners to: 1) promote and implement the Oregon Plan for Salmon and Watersheds; 2) improve landowner involvement in conservation activities that enhance water quality and habitat for salmon; and 3) develop assessments and apply strategies to achieve the goals of the Oregon Plan.	141,860



<b>Outreach</b> Provided funding to support a the STEWARDS Youth Watershed Council program, intended to engage students in civic and watershed enhancement activities as they learn about watershed ecology, watershed councils, and how to create change in their own communities through participating in democratic institutions.	59,392	
<b>Restoration</b> Thirteen grants provided funding for a variety of restoration projects that include addressing invasive plants; reducing sediment and nutrients from entering streams; creating irrigation efficiencies; and improving riparian and instream habitat, and fish passage. For example, a project in the Calapooia Watershed placed wood structures to restore stream channel processes that reconnect floodplain habitat, develop pools, and sort gravel; and replaced culverts with bridges to allow fish to access upstream habitat.	566,024	
<b>Technical Assistance</b> Funds provided to develop restoration designs to improve connectivity during low-to-moderate flows in perennial side channels and seasonally inundated channels; prepare a restoration and management plan, including plant community and wetland inventory, cultural resources survey, and fish survey; and develop a priority proposal and strategic action plan for a Willamette Focused Investment Partnership.	191,664
