Local Capacity-SWCD Funds provided to one Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) to implement the Agricultural Water Quality Management Area Plan to the fullest extent practical. This project includes providing outreach and technical assistance to local landowners to: 1) promote and implement the Oregon Plan for Salmon and Watersheds; 2) improve landowner involvement in conservation activities that enhance water quality and habitat for salmon; and 3) develop assessments and apply strategies to achieve the goals of the Oregon Plan.	141,860	
Monitoring Funds were provided for water quality monitoring and collecting flow data to help interpretation.	223,681	
Restoration Sixty-four grants provided funding for a variety of restoration projects that include addressing invasive plants; managing western juniper; developing off-stream watering sites; creating irrigation efficiencies; installing riparian exclusion fencing; and improving grazing management, riparian, instream, and upland habitat. Many of these projects involved changes to current irrigation systems, which helps to conserve water and improve water quality by reducing nitrates, E.coli, pesticides, and excess sediment from entering streams. For example, several furrow-irrigated fields were converted to a pivot-sprinkler system to eliminate runoff and prevent soil loss.	2,478,577	


